In the matter of "targeted versus defined pensions", we continue to monitor the Federal Government action on this issue. A sub-committee of the National Board is working to convince the CBC to change the Pension plan to allow spouses who married CBC employees after the employee retired to collect surviving spouse benefits. This provision would apply to all co-habitation situations.

Every three years the Members of the Ontario Region must hold an election for the position of President, Vice-President, Treasurer and Secretary. This will happen at the Annual General Meeting to be held October 30th. I encourage everyone to seriously consider becoming involved. You will receive great satisfaction knowing that you are contributing to the welfare of your peers.

SUPPLEMENTARY HEALTH CARE PLAN CHANGES/ IMPORTANT INFORMATION RE DRUG PLAN AND \$100 DEDUCTIBLE

In December 2017, the CBC mailed out a pamphlet to all retirees providing a summary of the changes to the SHCP. On page 3, it stated that the \$100.00 deductible required by the Ontario Drug Benefit plan would be fully covered

by our plan. Several of us discovered quite quickly that it is not covered 100%. Discussions took place with GWL and the CBC and the Ontario Region Board was provided clarification.

With the new play the co-pay (\$4.11) was put into the cost of the prescription as well as the \$100.00 deductible for the ODB. Here is the official statement received by the Ontario Region:

Essentially, the \$100 provincial deductible is the same as for the per prescription dispensing fee ... the retiree will share in the total drug cost so the \$100 retiree-paid deductible will be reimbursed by GWL at the reimbursement level of 75% (so 25% of it is paid by the retiree, just like the per prescription dispensing fee). So in effect, Great-West Life is picking up 75% of the cost of the drug as well as 75% of the provincial deductible and the prescription fee. (In other words, you will no longer be responsible for the whole payment of the \$100.00 provincial deductible – only 25% of it). And once it's met, that will no longer show up on your invoice.

BALCH, Nicki – died on July 11, 2018 at the age of 96. Nicki worked as a make-up artist in Toronto which included 5 years working on Nightcap.

WILLIAMS, Don S. – died on October 28, 2019 at the age of 80. Don wrote, directed and eventually became the executive producer on the Beachcombers. He was involved in many other CBC productions including Doctor Bundolo comedy series.

CHVOSTEK, Milo – died on November 8, 2018 at the age of 86. Milo was a producer with The Nature of Things.

WRAITE, Toni – died on November 22, 2018 at the age of 80. Toni was the post-production co-ordinator for TV Dramatic programming in Toronto.

MEGGS, Peter – died on December 2, 2018 at the age of 93. Besides his involvement in programs like Concern and Open House (a forerunner of Tapestry), he was national director of English Radio, co-authoring the report that led to what became "the radio revolution".

MCCAW, Ross - died on December 2, 2018 in his 86th year. Ross was a Senior Television MCR Technician, TV Technical Services in Toronto.

SERVICE, Robert (Bob) – died on December 7, 2018 at the age of 84. Bob retired as Manager, TV Network Operations, Toronto, in 1992.

PARKS, Penny – died on December 14, 2018 at the age of 65. Penny was producer and then senior producer of Quirks and Quarks for 13 years.

MACLEAR, Michael – died on December 25, 2018 at at the age of 89. Michael was a foreign correspondent for CBC News from 1961-71, reporting over his long career from over 80 countries.

CRORY, Neil – died on January 10, 2019 at the age of 68. Neil was Senior Music Producer in CBC Radio Music, recording some of Canada's finest classical musicians and singers.

CLARIDGE, Jeannie – died on January 12, 2019. Jeannie was an AD (script assistant) on various programs including Take 30 and Adrienne Clarkson and also worked in both sports and news.

MESS, Suzanne – died on January 22, 2019 at the age of 90. Suzanne was a Costume Designer in the CBC Design Department in Toronto, one of her first creations being the costumes worn by Uncle Chichimus and Hollyhock on the inaugural broadcast of CBC's English television network.

LYNTWYN, Bill - died on January 28, 2019 at the age fo 69. Bill was one of CBC's first ENG cameramen.

EVENDEN, Ron - died on January 29, 2019 in his 90th year. Ron was a lighting director in Toronto.

FORD, Patrick – died on January 31, 2019 at the age of 94. Patrick was a Unit Manager of TV Sports.

SCHLESINGER, Joe – died on February 11, 2019 at the age of 90. Joe was a television journalist and author most renowned for his work as a foreign correspondent for CBC TV.

DE NIVERVILLE, Louis – died on February 11, 2019 at the age of 85. Louis was a well-known artist who early in his long career worked as a graphic artist in the CBC Design Department from 1957 to 1963.

MYERS, Toni - died on February 18, 2019 at the age of 75. Toni started at CBC as an assistant editor on episodes of Telescope and this eventually led to work on This Hour has Seven Days. She is best known for her many IMAX documentaries.

FAIRE, Sandra – died on February 27, 2019. Sandra during her early CBC career worked as a Producer of Variety/Light Entertainment programs and later produced a number of award winning programs for the network including Rita and Friends and Anne Murray's Family Christmas.

SMITH, David (Dave) - died on March 1, 2019 in his 57th year. Dave was an editor on The National for a number of years.

CROSSLEY, Douglas – died on March 22, 2019 at the age of 83. Doug began his television career in the late 50s singing on CBC's Country Club, Holiday Ranch, Swing Easy and The Canadian Hit Parade.
