President's Report

I would like to thank you for your support in re-electing me as your President for 3 more years. In the coming year we will be concentrating on updating our Bylaws to conform with the new National Bylaws.



The controversy of Bill C-27 appears to be behind us now. It died when Parliament took its recess leading into the election. With the Liberal minority government in place, we strongly believe that the Bill will not be re-introduced. The matter of the government trying to get it in through the back door has also been stopped. The mandate of the Pension office can only be changed by a vote in Parliament.

The National Board of the PNA continues to fight for change to the Pension Plan to extend pension benefits to spouses that married after the employee retired. The review of the Memorandum of Agreement covering the distribution of the pension surplus and controlling costs of employee healthcare continues.

At our recent Annual General Meeting in Toronto, elections were held for the Ontario Region Board. Your new Vice-President is Raj Narain. Ben Daube returns as Treasurer and Gino Piazza is our Secretary. Three Toronto Directors were also elected: Mary Depoe, Gail Carducci and Steve Athey. I offer my congratulations to all those elected and I look forward to working with them.

AGM...GUEST SPEAKER

Dan Oldfield, PNA's representative on the Consultative Committee on Staff Benefits, was our guest speaker.

He spoke of his role on the Supplementary Health Care Committee, stressing that the plan is 100% funded by pensioners with no monetary input by the CBC. As a result of a restructuring of our benefit package two years ago, our rates have slowly decreased and become more competitive with the result that in the coming year we should see a monthly decrease of between \$25.00 and \$30.00 in Ontario. The plan was also opened up to potential new enrollees resulting in approximately 200 new members joining.

Dan touched on the Special Assistance Fund which has provided over a million dollars to Pensioners in the last ten years to help cover the cost of things like mobility devices and hearing aids. Information can be found on the National website under Programs and both Dianne St. Germaine and Suzie Bougie who staff the National Office (1-877-361-9242) are ready to help.

Dan went on to comment on the PNA itself, the importance of keeping it strong and the need for continued recruitment. The CBC collects our dues and remits them to the Association. The Association, in turn, is the official voice of CBC Pensioners with the Corporation and is one of the signatories to the Memorandum of Agreement on pension surplus sharing. There is a requirement for the MOA to be reviewed every ten years and Dan is our lead on this process which is currently underway.

Our status with the Corporation only remains viable, however, as long as the PNA membership remains above 50% of all pensioners. It's a challenge. There are approximately 10,000 pensioners out there now. If they don't join at the point of retirement it is difficult to find out who they are. And, of course, our members die (although we are an amazing long-living lot!).

In the recruitment process, there are lots of talking points ... the social meetings and the loyalty programs, but the most important is advocacy. As Dan noted, we look after ourselves, we fight for a fair deal on benefits, we are the ones the employer has to talk to, we keep an eye on our pensions and as noted above we helped drive the initiative to make sure we got our fair share of any future pension surpluses.

Dan's final remarks focussed on RIFFs and the position the National Board took at its meeting in October. It unanimously passed a motion to join with other retiree groups in advocating for the removal of the requirement to take out a minimum amount each year.

JOHN DIXON: A TRIBUTE

John was a founding member of the Ontario Region of the CBC Pensioners National Association as we know it today and, in fact, the first meeting was held in his basement on December 14, 1999. John was the Region's first VP and together with President Walter Wicks and the Board, they recruited members, developed by-laws and organized monthly board meetings. The first General Meeting was held in a church basement with over 200 attending. Everyone donated \$1.00 to cover the cost of cookies and coffee and a nice donation was given to the church on each occasion.



From these beginnings John has been instrumental in moving the association forward...by helping to put the first "Livewire" together, choosing with three others the CBC PNA logo, finding a company to manufacture our lapel pin, organizing the set-up of meetings for the South Western, Golden Horseshoe and Mid-Western Chapters and travelling to Sudbury/Elliot Lake and Thunder Bay biannually to ensure members there were informed and felt included. He has been part of the organization of the annual Ontario Region Christmas luncheon since 2003, has arranged for guest speaker at AGMs, was a delegate to the PNA Founding Convention in Montreal in June 2000 and has attended several triennial conventions since.

John served as Vice-President from 1999 to 2007, President from 2007 to 2010, Immediate Past President from 2010 to 2016 and Vice-President again from 2016 to 2019. On many occasions over the years, John has filled in as Editor of LIVEWIRE. In 2012 John was awarded a Life Membership for services rendered by the National Association of our Pensioners.

And now, John will be stepping down from official duties for the first time in 20 years. His wise counsel and calm demeanor on the board will be truly missed, but I suspect his involvement in the Ontario Region will not end giving advice when needed, correcting us when we don't get it right, selling Christmas luncheon tickets and attending the Region Chapters various functions.

And finally, a quote from John back in 2012:



In all, it has been and still remains a pleasure to serve our members and it has been a great learning experience for me.

IRENE ROBINSON: A TRIBUTE

Irene has been a member at large and/or a director on the Ontario Regional board since 2002. Looking back through meeting minutes and motions, she was always present and always involved. Over the past many years, she has arranged many of the Toronto activities and outings, including Pompeii at the ROM, a boat cruise in the harbour, a wine tour to the Niagara region, a tour of the Aga Khan, shows at Famous People Players and a trip to Ripley's Aquarium. She has also been one of the two key people organizing the Ontario Region Christmas lunch. With John Dixon, she found downtown venues, organized door prizes, sold tickets and checked folks in at the door. We couldn't have done all this without her.

Irene decided this year not to run again as a director...which is not to say she won't be consulted with and involved in this up-coming Christmas lunch on December 7th.


