# The beat goes on

### **CBC Pension Surplus Sharing Update (Oct. 14, 2023)**

Work is continuing towards implementation of the payout of the CBC Pension Plan surplus. The Pensioners National Association had hoped that payouts would be made before the end of this year, but recent developments have left that in doubt.

We have been notified by the Office of the Superintendent of Financial Institutions (OSFI), the federal body that regulates pension plans, that it is seeking to confirm that contributors, employees and pensioners have been appropriately consulted before funds can be distributed.

We have been told OSFI requires that two-thirds of all contributors must agree to the distribution of pension surpluses. It seems the regulator is prepared to accept that the unions represent all of their members, but while the PNA is recognized by the CBC as the only official representative of pensioners, it does not

have the same kind of legal recognition. OSFI is therefore requiring further evidence of the will of retirees.

We have consequently written to OSFI and provided itwith a fuller picture of our involvement in negotiating and ratifying the agreement. We've also provided it with our incorporation document, details of a survey conducted with all retirees last year, the final communique alerting retirees and employees of the deal, as well as a copy of the Memorandum of Understanding with the CBC that identifies the PNA as the official voice of pensioners at the CBC.

We are hopeful our submission will assist in convincing the regulator its concerns have been addressed.

We are confident the vast majority of employees and retirees support the payout, and that it will go ahead as agreed in the MOA. What we cannot know is what the impact will be on the timing of the payout.

One last thing - we are hoping to meet with CBC officials this coming week to discuss the process.

We will continue to update you on developments.

## **Pub gathering:** CBC retirees meet 6 and greet at Noonan's in Toronto

Between 75 and 80 CBC retirees met at Noonan's pub on the Danforth in Toronto on Oct. 4.

It was the second such event in four months. Retirees bought their own drinks and the PNA paid for the snacks which were really tasty.

There was a very special guest on hand. It was Sean Fitzpatrick of the law firm Cavalluzzo.

Sean was the lead lawyer for the Pensioners National Association and the Canadian Media Guild in the recent victory over the CBC to secure a share of the Corporation's huge pension fund surplus.
