Our national association has several affinity programs that could help members save money. With the rebranding of Anthony Insurance and Johnson's Insurance as bellairdirect, one member sent us a note about how she lowered her premiums. Here's part of it:

Last week I received my home insurance renewal, which of course, had gone up in price. Yesterday, I received a notice from the CBC PNA that belairdirect is the association's "official partner."

I called belairdirect a few minutes ago. When I said I was a member of the Pensioners Association, my premium was recalculated and I'm now saving \$147/yr. I was told when my auto insurance renews in the fall, there'll be another discount applied, but not as much as with the home insurance.

Pensioners Coalition meets with federal Seniors Minister

Jon Soper represented our association when the <u>provincial pensioners</u> <u>coalition</u> met with the federal minister responsible for Seniors, Seamus O'Regan, in St. John's on March 13. The discussions included the need for a national seniors strategy, pharmacare, the implementation of a national dental plan, safe long-term care and the impact of ageism on older people in the workforce. The meeting lasted 45 minutes, but O'Regan agreed to meet again to discuss other important issues.
