

Dan Oldfield will be guest speaker

Dan Oldfield was elected as PNA national president earlier this year.

As everyone knows, Dan is the person most responsible for securing our share of the CBC Pension Fund surplus.

He's the one who led negotiations for the deal with the Corporation 15 years ago.

Then, when the CBC tried to renege on the deal in 2019, Dan led pensioners and current employees to a sweeping victory in a lengthy arbitration.

CBC pensioners are also



getting ready for the latest pension surplus distribution process.

It looks a lot like what happened the first time around.

The CBC will be contacting all of us soon, seeking consent to share the pension surplus declared following the Dec. 31, 2023 actuarial valuation.

Approximately \$55 million

dollars will be shared between 20,000 pensioners and employees.

As before, the federal pension regulator (OSFI) requires the consent of twothirds of pensioners.

That means you will have to fill out a form like last year's.

However, there is a silver lining. This time, OSFI will recognize the consent for five years.

Assuming our pension plan continues to generate large enough surpluses, we will not have to fill out the consent forms for another five years.

The PNA will be available to help out when the CBC circulates the forms.
